THE NUMBERS BEHIND THE INSPIRATION

In a city as richly diverse as Houston, true educational excellence means creating learning environments that respond to and celebrate each student's unique identity and potential. This year's Houston Schools That Inspire are doing just that and the results speak volumes.

Students who attended free public Pre-K were twice as likely to be ready for Kindergarten, 6 percentage points less likely to be chronically absent, and showed stronger English proficiency than their peers. These early investments are paying off—and they're helping all kinds of learners get a strong start that lasts.

WHY EARLY EDUCATION MATTERS

Kids who go to Pre-K are more prepared for reading and math in school, more likely to graduate from high school and attend college and earn more money in their careers.

Across all Houston-region ISDs, Black, Hispanic, Emergent Bilingual (EB), and Economically Disadvantaged (EcoDis) students who attended Pre-K were more likely to be kindergarten ready than their peers who did not attend Pre-K.
